Fifty three children continue to be the heart of the YCH. But very touching moments in the month of December were when our older boys and a girl who are settled in life outside YCH visited us on the Foundation day of the organization and Christmas. Six of

the boys working with different firms in the city, assisted the ICID team in logistics during foundation day celebrations. Two of them - Praful and Geetha joined us for Christmas celebrations with their partners and children. Two boys Shankar and Neeraj who have been working in other cities came down for Christmas vacation and assisted in

Christmas celebrations. Another boy, Mangesh

who married last year came with the good news that he has become a proud father of a baby girl. This shows that the flame of love for YCH is still burning in their hearts!

In the month of November, during Diwali vacations, the children enjoyed a bollywood film in a nearby mall. Twenty boys participated in the Pro Health Marathon 2016 (in 3 kms category) in Nagpur on 13<sup>th</sup> November organized by the Pro Health Foundation.

The third week of November was special to all the children as various events marked the National Children's Day and Universal Children's Day. They not only participated in a rally with placards on child sexual exploitation organized by CHILDLINE (an emergency phone



and outreach helpline for children in distress) in the city on 14<sup>th</sup> November but also performed a street play before a huge crowd on the streets of the city on child right protection. Two city based schools and a youth group

December 8, was a special day in the life of every child of YCH for which they anxiously had been waiting. They had worked hard and prepared themselves well



to perform dances and songs on a well illuminated stage before a huge audience of about 400! It was a wonderful experience watching them performing so confidently and joyfully. There was not a single person who did not appreciate their talents.

December 11 was another special day. The children were part of the children's festival organized by ICID where about 450 children from various project areas (slums) participated. They performed dances, played games in the stalls and won prizes ... a day for complete fun.



The YCH celebrated Christmas with great enthusiasm. The children had worked almost two weeks (evening hours) in order to make a beautiful crib under the guidance of Fr. Philomen Raj. Two city based schools two
